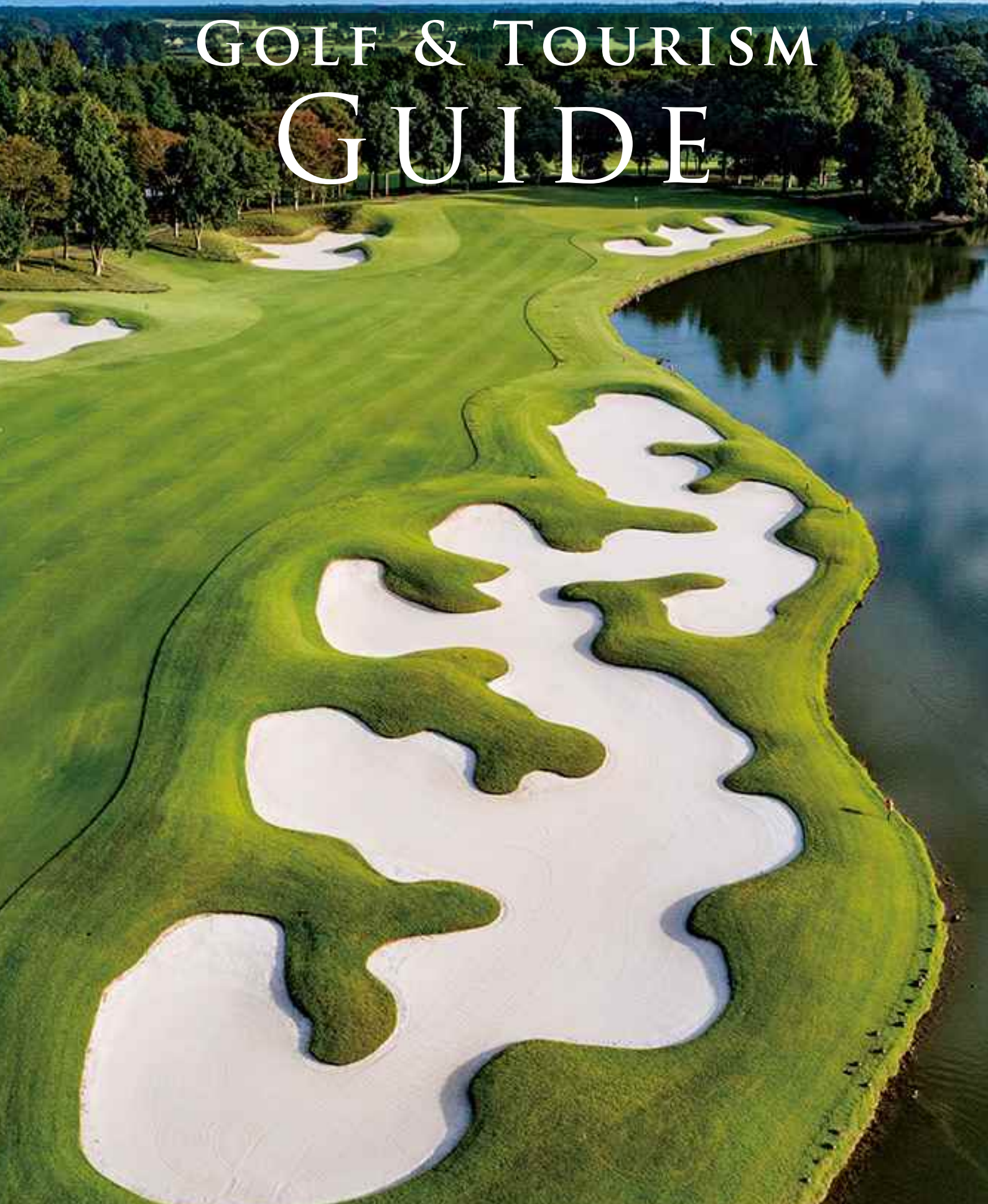

Ibaraki is an area in which the amazing golf courses of Japan are mainly concentrated

According to data announced by R&A in 2019, Japan ranks No.3 in the world after America and Canada. It has more golf courses than Scotland and England, where it is said that golf first originated. And a total of 114 of Japan's golf courses are located in Ibaraki Prefecture. Ibaraki accounts for just 1.6 percent of Japan's total landmass, which means it has an extremely high density of golf courses.

The main feature is many courses with flat and beautiful water hazards

Ibaraki Prefecture is located in the northern part of the Kanto Plain on Japan's largest flatlands. Its entire coastline faces the Pacific Ocean to the east. In addition, it is blessed with Kasumigaura and other lakes. Golf can be played on these courses throughout all four seasons, taking advantage of these topographical merits since there is hardly any snow cover, even during the middle of winter. Many courses are favoured with land formations that provide wide and flat fairways. The clever layout of lakes and creeks enables shots to be enjoyed against beautiful panoramas throughout all four seasons. It goes without saying that many golf clubs boast championship courses that provide the stage for Japan's major tournaments.



Convenient access from overseas and from the center of Tokyo

Narita International Airport, the gateway to Japan, is located to the south of Ibaraki, and the prefecture also plays host to Ibaraki Airport, which serves international flights. In addition, a convenient railway network and a series of expressways link the prefecture with the center of Tokyo. It also has easy access to Tokyo Station, the starting point for the nation's shinkansen bullet trains, and Haneda International Airport, thereby providing smooth travel.

1 Bobos Country Club Kujigawa Course

With a number of distinctive and unique holes, this course offers golfers a wide variety of playing experiences. In addition, a hotel annexed to the course makes it a great location for meetings, research activities, and study and observation trips.

This course, rich with ups and downs typical of hilly courses, has a variety of interesting aspects. There are two-tiered greens, valley crossings, super downhill shots, and par-4 holes where it is possible to make the green off the tee. This course provides unique attractions to players by offering experiences that are not available elsewhere. The hotel is annexed to the clubhouse and has 49 rooms, a swimming pool, and banquet halls, making it an excellent location to combine business with pleasure.

2 Shin Seizansou Country Club

With a backdrop of a splendid landscape overlooking the Pacific Ocean, this course demands a precise, accurate strategy.

The course, designed by Pete Dye, who also worked on TPC Sawgrass in Florida, fully represents the unique style of its creator. Although it is located on hilly terrain, at first sight, it resembles a typical links course. However, intrinsic undulations peculiar to the British-American style, distinctive floating green islands, and other hazards force a player to make bold decisions and precise shots. This course is definitely worth trying at least once.

Ibaraki Royal Country Club

Enjoy powerful tee shots on this flat and vast course.

At this course, most of the holes have wide fairways with an open view and putting greens visible from the tee. The diversity of large greens is impressive, including narrow-stretched greens, wide greens, and uniquely-shaped greens. Three-tiered and other undulating greens make the course highly strategic. The course also has lodges for accommodation, and there are BBQs in summer and charcoal-grilled meals in a traditional sunken hearth to enjoy in winter.

Mana Golf Club

Surrounded by a natural oak and cherry blossom forest, this course has 18 distinctive flat holes.

On this course, many of the front nine holes are flat and straight with most of the putting greens being visible from tee-off, whereas the back nine holes are long, with winding doglegs, ponds, and other hazards. This strategic course encourages players to challenge themselves by coming back, again and again, to try new things after improving their skills. Players of different levels can fully enjoy the true delight of golf here.

A strategic but well-balanced course layout with all 18 holes suitable for orthodox players. Approximately 890m² vast bent grass greens with beautiful undulations and seven skillfully laid out lakes of different sizes make this course enjoyable both for beginners and golfers with a single-figure handicap. There are also two kinds of accommodation – a resort hotel and a villa – both equipped with natural hot springs baths.

The course layout is comparatively flat despite its hilly location and has a total of 27 holes equally divided into three courses. The eastern course, bounded by large pine trees, is filled with a quiet calm atmosphere. The lakes and bunkers of the vast flat middle course are key points requiring strategic tactics. The western course, with the second and third holes separated by a pond, and the especially tough seventh hole, demands precise shots.

While Ibaraki is rich with flat lands, this course offers players the freshness of nature and a stately mountain range view. All 18 holes are straight and flat or downhill, allowing players to check each hazard and think through a game strategy from teeing ground to green. As the course is located in a picturesque area, in spring, players can delight in the game among the rows of cherry blossoms around the course and wild cherry blossoms that cover the mountains in a blaze of color.

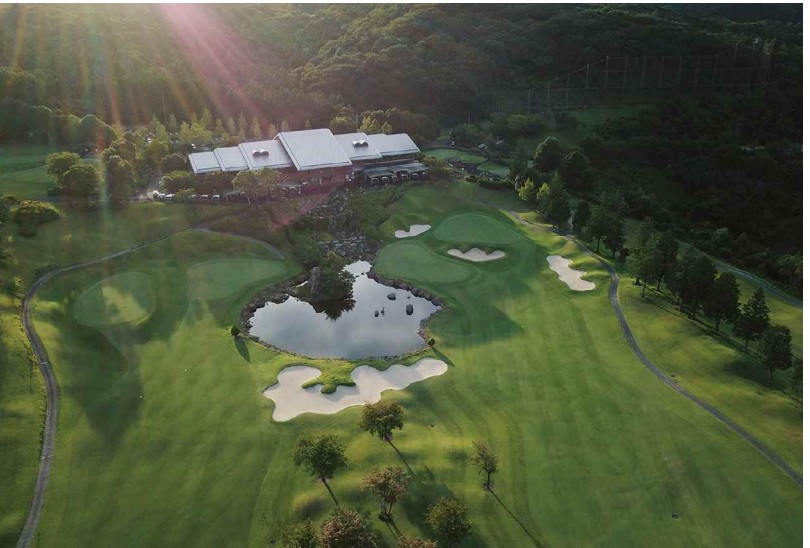

Named after Robin Hood's Sherwood Forest, it has hosted PGA senior and women's professional golf tournaments. Freshly-prepared food made with seasonal ingredients can also be enjoyed at any time in the restaurant overlooking the course, one highlight being the lunchtime buffet combining Japanese and Western cuisine.

This highly strategic course was designed by Jack Nicklaus, the “Emperor” of golf, who proclaimed it “the best golf course I know in Japan”. It has hosted the Acom International, a men's professional tournament, consecutively for eight years, and the Honma Tour World Cup in 2015 and 2016. It will also be a competition ground for the DP World Tour (PGA European Tour) held in Japan in April 2022 for the first time. Today, the course is renowned for being the leading tournament course in Japan.

A tree-lined course with impressive beautiful views, wide flat fairways, an island green, and many holes all surrounded by small lakes.

Most holes on this course are straight with putting greens visible from the teeing grounds, which make for comfortable shots onto the wide fairways. The main feature of the course is the 18th hole, with an island green surrounded by a lake. Another feature is the diversity of scenic layouts, including an impressive 100-yard bunker. The golf carts are equipped with GPS navigation systems and are permitted on the fairways, making the course comfortable and enjoyable for a wide range of players, from women and seniors right through to expert golfers.

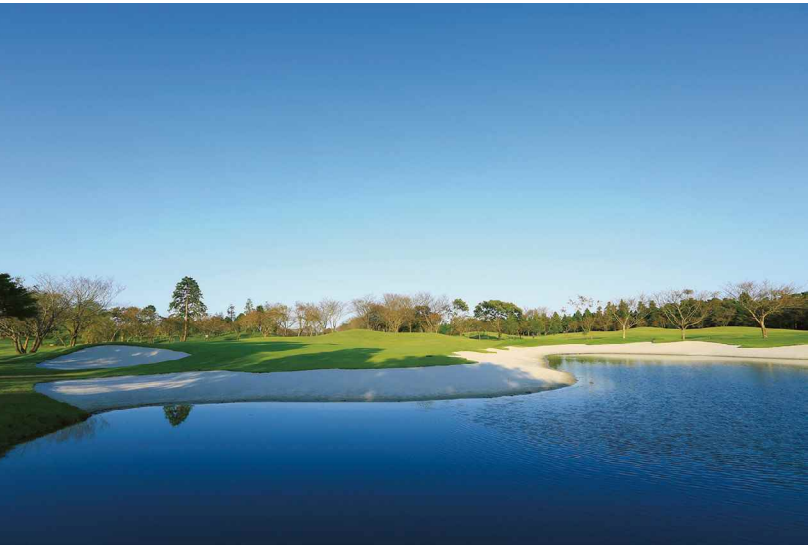

A world-class championship course, with the longest hole of 705 yards.

This luxurious 8,143-yard course, located on flat ground with less than two meters in height difference, is a beautiful waterside course with abundant lakes. All fairways are wide enough to encourage powerful drives, although options get narrowed down from the second shot, made more difficult by the ever-present mounds and lakes throughout the course. The accumulated wisdom of various specialists in every feature, from layout design to interior details, makes this a truly world-class golf course.

Central Golf Club New Course

Designed by Tom Watson, the landscape design of this course has left a lot of primary natural woodland. Although being rather short, this strategic course requires changing tactics depending on the drop area of tee shots.

Tom Watson has designed this course to put all 14 clubs to use. The beauty and inexplicable charm of the course makes players want to come back for the challenge again and again. Although it is relatively short, the strategic characteristics of the course are enhanced by the cunningly located hazards, and there are also four tee grounds, each of which requires a different strategic approach. Some holes may look easy at first sight but are actually quite difficult, and vice versa, this is what keeps players interested and coming back for more.

Central Golf Club

Opened in 1974, this course with a long tradition has been selected as the stage for many official professional and amateur tournaments, such as the Japan PGA Championship and the Japan Open Golf Championship.

There are 36 holes on the eastern and western courses, surrounded by numerous pine, cedar, camphor, and birch trees. Although the eastern course has a spacious layout with many holes for full-force shots, there are dangerously located cross bunkers and slightly undulating fairways as well. The western course is designed more strategically, with gentle up- and downhills making it harder to grasp the distance, water hazards, and dog-legs. These two true championship courses are waiting for you to try your hand.

This course is conveniently located with good connections to metropolitan Tokyo and GPS-equipped carts, allowed on fairways.

This woodland course was designed by Shiro Akaboshi, one of the prominent Japanese golf course designers. With lush pine forests secluding the holes, lakes of different sizes arranged throughout, and high-rimmed bunkers enhancing strategic complexity, this course is raising competitive spirit among players. Along with the delights of playing golf, the course also combines beautiful natural sceneries. With the backdrop of Ibaraki' s famous peak, Mt. Tsukuba, to the north, this course offers seasonal blooming. Players can admire plums in March, cherry blossoms in early April, and rhododendrons from mid-April.

This flat woodland course with spacious fairways has almost no elevation. Cedars and other trees pleasantly split the layout, with other trees planted here and there serving as hazards. Left and right dog-legs enhance the diversity of the holes' layouts, which also adds to the thrill and challenge of playing this course. Two-seater carts are available to use on fairways, even on rainy days, making play comfortable in any weather. Another merit of the course is its convenient access: it is located 40 km from central Tokyo.

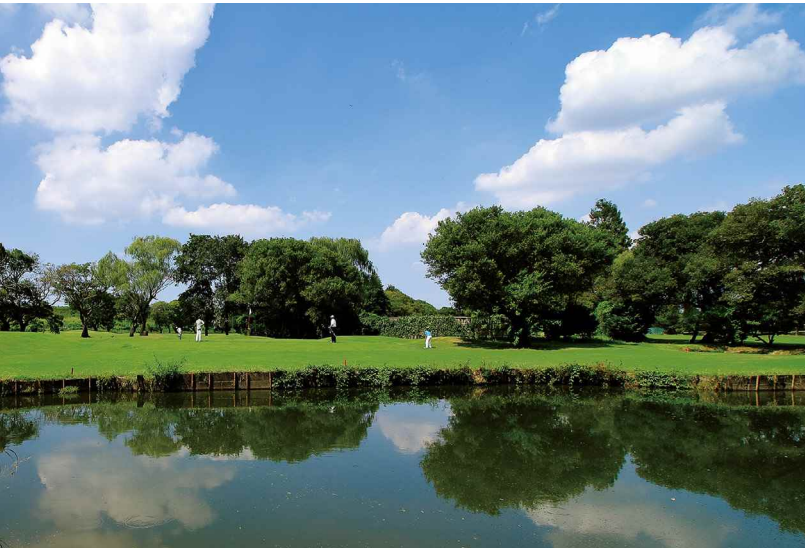

Enjoy this waterway, forested flat course with carts equipped with multilingual GPS navigation. Each hole here is secluded with trees, and skillfully arranged small rivers and lakes make it difficult to reach a good score without carefully working out attacking tactics. This course is designed with the accuracy of shots in mind rather than distance. The convenient access – only 45 minutes by car from central Tokyo – makes the course even more attractive.

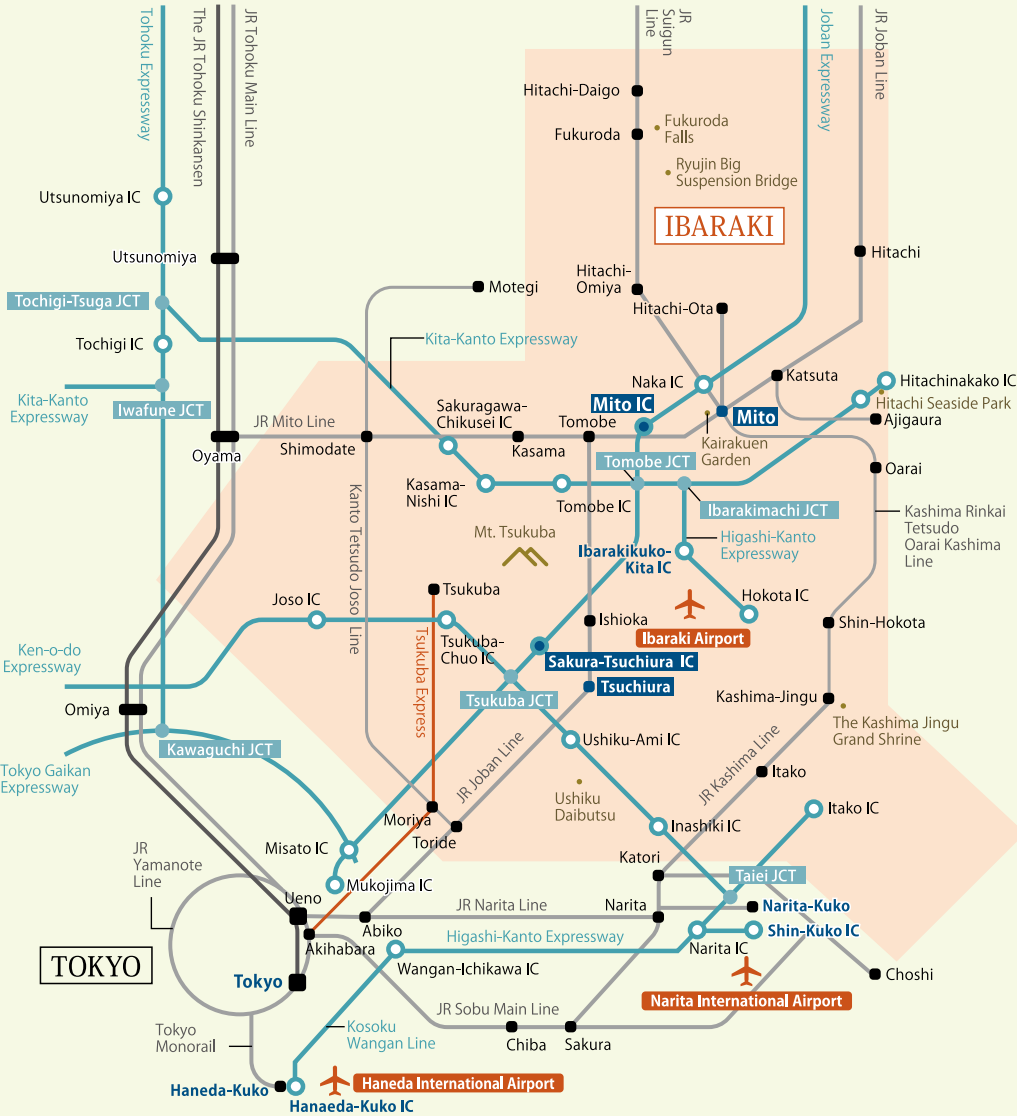

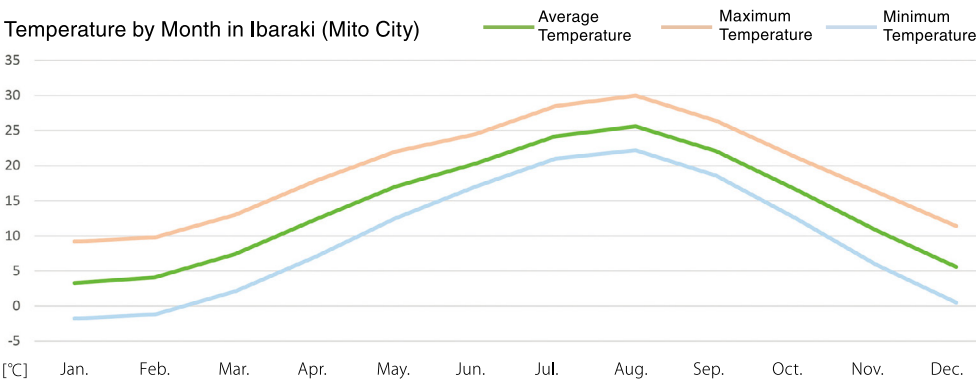

Hitachi Seaside Park

A park spread over 215 hectares on the coast of the Pacific Ocean. Visitors can enjoy an enormous quantity of flowers and blossoms throughout all four seasons, including nemophila flowers, daffodils, and tulips in the spring, poppies and roses in early summer, zinnias and sunflowers in midsummer, kochia and cosmos in the fall, and ice tulips in the winter, etc. In particular, the 5,300,000 blue nemophilas that are spread out facing the spacious beach provide a scene that is reminiscent of a fantasy world. Hitachi Seaside Park is a popular sightseeing spot visited by many tourists from both Japan and overseas.

A statue of Buddha standing 120 meters tall is registered in the Guinness Book of Records as "the world's tallest bronze Buddha statue". This statue is approximately three times taller than the Statue of Liberty in New York. It is possible to enter the Buddha and enjoy the magnificent scenery from observation windows located in the chest at the height of 85 meters above ground level, which provides views in all four directions. Sutra-copying experience is also very popular.

The Kashima Jingu Grand Shrine

The Kashima Jingu Grand Shrine is the most historical shrine in eastern Japan. Although Japan has many shrines, up until recently, only three shrines were considered to be worthy of this title—Ise Grand Shrine, Katori Shrine, and Kashima Shrine—and the extensive lineage and history behind this shrine make it a very special place. The shrine is also famous for being a power spot, with its sacred 1,300-year-old tree standing approximately 40 meters tall, and a pond for washing the hands before praying through which more than 400,000 liters of spring water flow every day.

Ryujin Big Suspension Bridge

The Ryujin Gorge is still linked today to a legend of a dragon. The Ryujin Suspension Bridge is suspended across this beautiful V-shaped ravine above the Ryujin Dam. The span of the bridge is 375 meters, which is one of the longest pedestrian bridges in Japan, and being suspended 100 meters above the surface of the dam enables visitors to enjoy amazing views and spectacular panoramas throughout all four seasons. The height of the bridge also makes dynamic bungee jumping a popular attraction.

Fukuroda Falls

The falls is one of Japan's three topmost waterfalls. It boasts a height of 120 meters and a width of 73 meters. When the falls cascade down through the four stages of rock walls, it has a gentle sight from afar as if white lace is being drawn over the falls, but it provides spectacular scenery when seen close as the water hurls itself majestically at the rocks. It also displays different expressions depending on the season, with the autumn colors of the fall and the fantastic sight of icefalls on frigid winter days are especially recommended. In addition, it is known as a power spot for soothing the soul, with a hiking course and hot spring baths located nearby.

Mt. Tsukuba

It has two peaks, and flourished as a sacred mountain from ancient times. The mountain plays host to more than 1,000 different species of rare trees and plants, and it is known as a treasure trove for botanists.





Seafood

Ibaraki Prefecture has 190 kilometers of coastline facing the Pacific Ocean, and it is blessed with abundant seafood. The Nakaminato Fish Market is a prominent sightseeing market in Japan, and it is visited by approximately one million sightseers.

Monkfish

The monkfish are favored as high-quality fish in countries on the Mediterranean Sea. This fish are also popular and indispensable fish in Ibaraki Prefecture. Feel free to enjoy monkfish cuisine prepared in typically Japanese styles.

Hitachi aki Soba Noodles

Ibaraki prefecture, one of Japan's prominent producers, have been cultivating Hitachi aki Soba for a long time. Therefore, they have become a high-quality brand product. It is renowned among Japan by its distinctive color, taste and fragrance.



Agriculture and fisheries prosper in Ibaraki Prefecture, and it is a treasure trove of food ingredients, including seafood and the fruits of the land. In addition to authentic Japanese cuisine made with fresh seasonal ingredients, it is also possible to taste the local cuisine that is characteristic of each region.



Hitachi Beef

Beef from brand cattle raised by designated producers in Ibaraki Prefecture. Its main feature is soft, fine-textured red meat with a full flavor. It is shipped to high-class hotels and Japanese restaurants in America and Southeast Asia, and it is therefore highly acclaimed not only in Japan, but also overseas.



Melons

Ibaraki prefecture is blessed with the fertile agricultural land of the Kanto Plain. It harvests large quantities of fruit and vegetables, including being the No.1 producer of melons that are highly acclaimed for their quality. Freshly-picked ripe melons are an amazing experience that one can only have in the areas that produce them. Melon picking during which it is possible to taste fresh, newly-picked fruit is also a popular pastime.



Sake (Japanese Rice Wine)

The elements that determine whether a sake tastes good or bad are the water and rice from which it is made. Ibaraki prefecture has rich supplies of freshwater abundant in minerals that are perfect for brewing rice wine. It also produces a unique species of rice designated for sake. Owing to this, it plays host to 41 breweries, the most in the Tokyo metropolitan area, and it is possible to enjoy sake specifically designed to their individual preferences.



Local Beer (Draft Beer)

In the same way as rice wine, the high-quality water resources available in Ibaraki prefecture are used for brewing beer. There are several breweries that make all types of craft beer, including ale, weizen, and pilsner, that match up perfectly with local cuisine.

Hot Springs

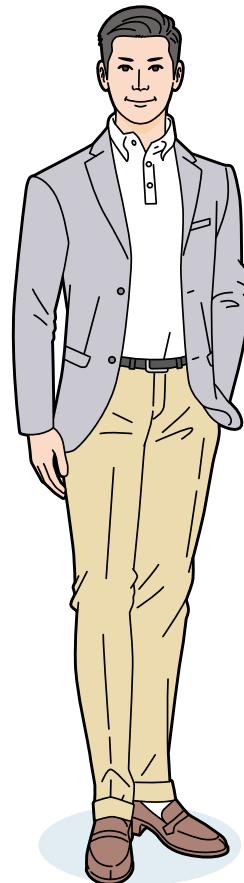

The Etiquette of Golf Manners and Customs in Japan

Golf is a popular sport in many countries of the world. It is regarded as a sport for ladies and gentlemen, and it has various kinds of rules and manners that differ from country to country. Although the basic rules are the same across the globe, there are different ways to enjoy it in each country and region. In Japan, for example, some people play golf because they want to get as much enjoyment out of it as possible; in contrast, others play because they wish to show as much hospitality to their clients as possible, and this has resulted in specific rules on golf courses that are not found in other countries. The following are basic golf rules and manners introduced to Japan's unique golf culture. There are details about golf customs that visitors from overseas are required to understand and the points to note when playing in Japan. Having read and understood these details, we hope you enjoy playing golf in Ibaraki Prefecture.

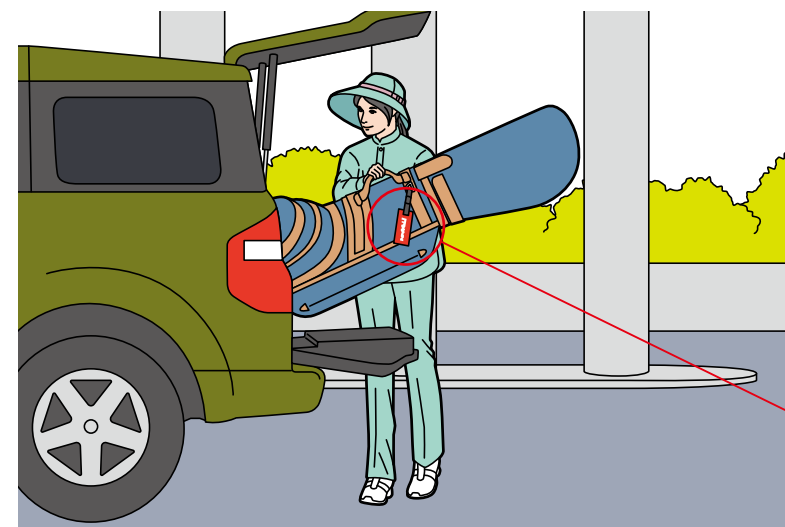

Proper clothing attires are required

Golf courses in Japan establishes dress codes. There is some strict attire protocol when visiting the clubhouse, aside from wearing jackets (except in summer). Jeans, T-shirts, sandals, and other such clothing, which may be acceptable overseas, must be avoided in Japan. Most golf courses in Japan also ban shoes with metal spikes, so you need to prepare rubber, soft-spike shoes or spikeless shoes.



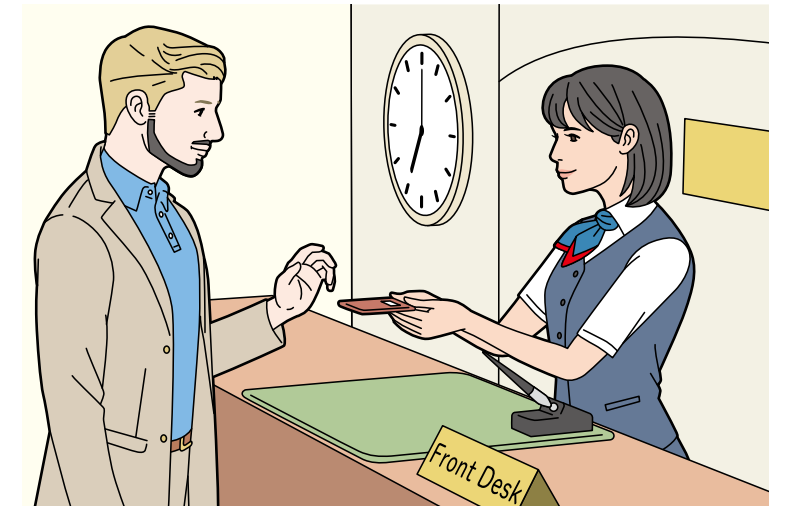
Staff members will assist you with golf bags

Members of the course staff will remove the bag from the trunk of your car and transport it to the starting point by cart. It is not necessary to pay a tip for this service. However, unloading and reloading the bag yourself on self-carry courses is required.

Important: Make sure your golf bag has a nameplate. Failure to observe this will mean that the staff members do not know to who the bag belongs to, and they will be unable to load it onto the cart.

Check-in at the front reception

Receptions are similar to those found in hotels are located just inside the clubhouses. Here you can check-in and receive your score card holders and locker keys. **Please make sure that you check-in at least thirty minutes prior to your reserved start at the latest.** After check-in, move to the locker room and change in the locker assigned to you. You will need to show your score card holder when taking lunch and when making purchases at the shops on the course, with the total amount being paid together at the time of check-out, so make sure you keep it with you at all times when on the course facilities.



Place all valuables in the safety deposit box

Safety deposit boxes are located near the reception on golf courses in Japan. If you arrive at the golf course with your passport, airline tickets, or any other valuables, make sure you store them in a safety deposit box, not your locker. If no safety deposit boxes are available, you may ask the receptionist to look after them when you check in.

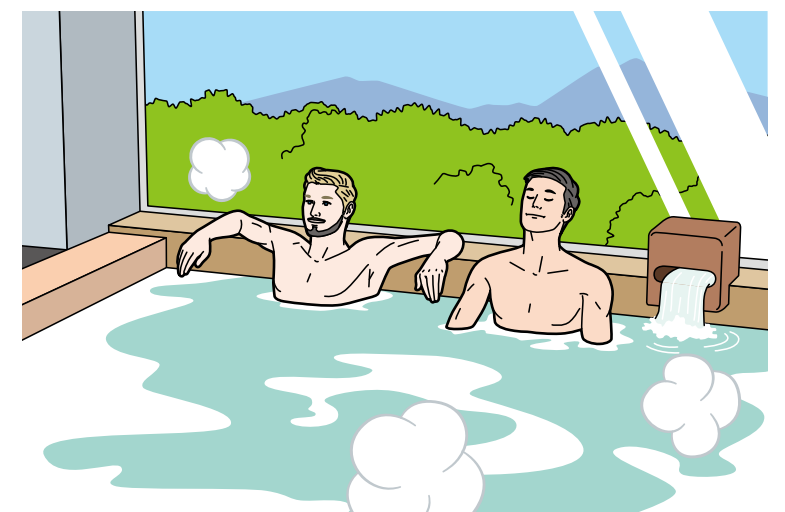
Lunchtime break is required at the half turn

In Japan, it is customary to play the first nine holes in the morning and the second nine holes in the afternoon after taking a lunch break for approximately one hour (although at some courses this rule may be avoided). This enables players to enjoy food prepared with fresh Ibaraki-produced seafood and other ingredients, as well as local specialty cuisine, in attractive restaurants.



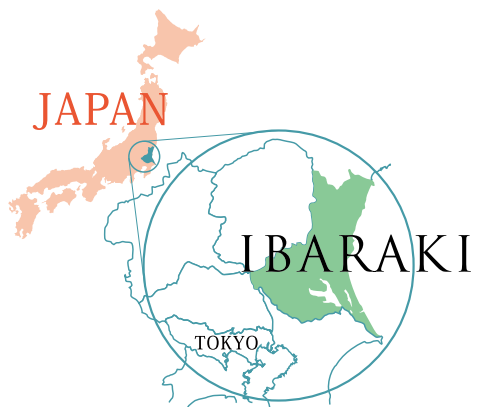
Refresh yourself in a hot bath after holing out

After playing your round, it is possible to bathe away your perspiration and refresh yourself in a hot bath. Usually golf courses in Japan have large baths equipped with shampoo, body soap, towels, etc. One of the rules of hot springs and other public baths in Japan is to wash your body prior to getting into the bath (use the pails located by the bath to scoop up water and pour it over your body). Therefore, it is unnecessary to wash your body in the shower before getting into the bath. Another rule is that towels must never be placed inside the bathwater. Also, please, be aware that some golf courses do not allow guests with tattoos to use public baths.



Make your payment during check-out at the reception or with automatic payment machines

It is customary in Japan to pay all costs at the reception when you leave. These costs will include the total sum of the expenses incurred when taking lunch, or purchasing items at the shops. Many courses have also installed automatic payment machines. In this case, you will need to swipe your score card holder over the scanner incorporated in these machines and pay accordingly. Most golf courses accept credit cards, as well.
